Magnet students enjoy a variety of opportunities

Matthew Brown (Class of 2020)

During the first week of June, Matthew participated in a Healthcare Academy hosted at Lipscomb University in Nashville, TN during which he learned about working in the health profession, as well as tests and cultural perspectives in healthcare. The next week, he went to Oxford College in Covington, GA for the 2019 Georgia Teen Institute as a Teen Advisory Council representative. The following week, Matthew traveled to Collegedale, TN to participate in a 3-day journalism camp hosted by Southern Adventist University. While there he learned how to write as a journalist and create a good story— he was even published!

Jimmy Cyganek (Class of 2021)

Jimmy's summer started with Personal Fitness at Lassiter HS. During the two week course, he was exposed to martial arts, dancing, yoga, pilates, bowling, Crossfit, and went on a behind-the-scenes tour of the Braves Stadium. Two days later, he left for the Governor's Honors Program (GHP) at Berry College in Rome, GA, where he



majored in Vocal Music and minored in French Cinema. Jimmy described the experience as "four incredible weeks" and decided to study French this year at school.

Dash Katragadda (Class of 2021)

Dash was able to intern at a semiconductors company in Silicon Valley last summer. He felt that the experience was interesting and that he gained insight into how the industry actually works. Dash was able to help build the machines and process silicon wafers to be coated.

Jacob Lee (Class of 2021)

Last summer Jacob played for one of the top 50 club lacrosse teams in the nation! Jacob traveled to Peru with his nonprofit techgapreboot.org and installed a technology system in a Family Hope Center. He also spent seven Wednesdays, along with other KMHS students and teachers, using technology to tutor homeless children in the Atlanta area.

Sara Makboul (Class of 2020)

Last summer Sara was an intern at a research & development firm in Kennesaw. She collaborated with two others and built two prototypes in the form of a six-week, rapid-prototyping robotics project. Sara was the only software developer on the team and she tested and programmed the robots in Python, Java, and C#. One final prototype was able to successfully heat an aluminum can containing coffee using rapidly alternating magnetic fields. The second prototype autonomously created a coke slushie in a can in less than three minutes using supercooling technology. Sara is excited because she will be included as an inventor on the prototype patent.


Teacher recommendations are requested through Naviance. The counselor rec is requested on the transcript card in the Counseling Office (not in Naviance).
