

Senior Transcripts & Letters of Recommendation

Click HERE for steps on how to request official transcripts and letters of recommendation

When requesting transcripts for college applications, students must fill out their transcript request card in the Counseling Office in addition to adding the request in Naviance. Cost is \$2 per transcript. Transcript fee may be paid either through MyPaymentsPlus or in the Counseling Office at the time of request.

A completed STUDENT PROFILE SHEET is required for all letters of recommendation and/or school reports.

Teacher recommendations are requested through Naviance. The counselor recommendation is requested on the transcript card in the Counseling Office, **not** in Naviance.

Scholarship counselor recommendations and transcripts are requested

on the transcript card in the Counseling Office, **not** in Naviance. If a teacher recommendation is needed, see the specific teacher.

Need help? Stop by the Counseling Office during lunch or before/after school. A counselor will also be available to assist you in the Writing Center: Tues, 10/8 & 10/15 before school.
