Star Student: Naisha Sylvestre



HOPE/Zell Miller Scholarship

- Important: It is essential that students have their social security number on file; otherwise, they will not be eligible.
- Students may check their HOPE GPA by creating an account at www.gafutures.org. This is the only place to check it; it is NOT listed on student transcripts.
- If an error message is received when students check their HOPE GPA, it is likely KMHS does not have their social security number on file. A copy of the social security card is one of the requirements for HOPE/Zell eligibility. Please email Mrs. LaRoy if you find this information needs to be updated.
- Students must apply for HOPE/Zell Miller during their senior year (after October 1st) by completing the FAFSA. Seniors may also complete the GSFAPP through www.gafutures.org.

Online summer courses through CVA and GAVS:

This is for students who are interested in taking a course over the summer-such as Health, Personal Fitness, or foreign language. You must pay for summer courses, the grade goes on your transcript, and is factored into your GPA.

- Students must complete and submit the CCSD online student agreement to Mrs. LaRoy, in addition to registering for the course. You can find it in the Courses & Scheduling Edmodo folder.
- CVA for Health and/or Personal Fitness (both are required for graduation) GAVS for foreign language. (1 credit courses end in "AB")
- CVA summer term registration opened April 21. GAVS summer term registration begins May 1.
- For those who have submitted an online agreement for next school year, GAVS will begin registration in May.
