
STAR Student: Paige Woodham




Congratulations!

At this time, juniors and freshmen should have completed their Bridge Law tasks through Naviance. To check if you have completed it, or for the steps, refer to instructions in the Edmodo Bridge Law folder

Researching/visiting colleges

There are various resources to research colleges. Two great sites to start with are Naviance and College Board BigFuture. Here are additional sites to check out:

- Map of University System of GA colleges: https://www.usg.edu/institutions/ (public colleges in-state)
- Academic Common Market: study in a specialized field at an out-of-state college and pay in-state tuition rates.

Visiting colleges –Recommendation: schedule a tour through the college (typically through the admissions office) and do some exploring on your own. If allowed, visit the library and student center as well. Chat with other students and even staff. If there's a particular major of interest, you may be able to connect with someone in that department by contacting them in advance.

You will want to visit while they are in session to get a true feel of campus life. If you have a college major in mind, this should be the main factor when considering different colleges.

Juniors, register for the SAT and/or ACT. Don't wait until the end of junior year! You will want to leave time to retest; most students will test 2-3 times. Most of you will apply to colleges early fall semester.

- Practice questions may be accessed on Khan Academy (SAT) and ACT Academy (via ACT site)
- If you took the PSAT/NMSQT, link College Board and Khan Academy accounts for a personalized SAT practice plan https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat/k12educators/advising-instruction/practice-resources/linkaccounts

Seniors:

- Handling Admission Decisions if you are deferred or denied admission https://sites.gatech.edu/admission-blog/
- Midyear transcripts/fall semester grades for colleges if the college you applied to requires a midyear transcript, submit your request via MPP beginning 1/15. For Common App schools, just submit one request in MPP. For the name of the college, enter "Common App midyear."
- Deferred? You will need to request a midyear transcript.
- Complete your FAFSA. This is also your application for HOPE/Zell

Paying for college:

- KMHS Scholarship Bulletin: Students may access it by signing in to Naviance, clicking on Colleges >> Scholarships & Money >> Scholarship Search. Many scholarships from local organizations have been added. We continue to update this throughout the school year. Naviance also has a "National Scholarship Search" for a larger range of opportunities.
- HOPE or Zell Miller Scholarship: requirements and details can be found at www.gafutures.org. Students in grades 10-12 can check their HOPE GPA at this site. HOPE GPA's will update again in February and will include freshmen. We must have the student's social security number on file to be eligible.
- Some colleges will offer their own institutional scholarships.
 There are also many different search engines out there,
 including Naviance, College Board, Fastweb, and more.
 Remember, you should never pay scholarship search or
 application fees!

Virtual College Visits

Students should access their Naviance account and select colleges they are

interested in. By doing so, they will receive notifications when representatives from their selected colleges host a virtual visit with KMHS students. All students must update their email address in Naviance. Please change it from your Office 365 to your personal email address. Once logged into Naviance >> About Me >> My Account. Click on the Edit pencil in the



"Contact" box, update your email address, click Save. Students may check their weighted and unweighted GPA in Naviance! About Me >> My Account

HOPE/Zell Miller Scholarship

- Important: It is essential that students have their social security number on file; otherwise, they will not be eligible.
- Students may check their HOPE GPA by creating an account at www.gafutures.org. This is the only place to check it; it is NOT listed on student transcripts.
- If an error message is received when students check their HOPE GPA, it is likely KMHS does not have their social security number on file. A copy of the social security card is one of the requirements for HOPE/Zell eligibility. Please email Mrs. LaRoy if you find this information needs to be updated.
- Students must apply for HOPE/Zell Miller during their senior year (after October 1st) by completing the FAFSA. Seniors may also may also complete the GSFAPP through www.gafutures.org.
